The **Industry Academic Fellowship (IAF)** program provides students with the opportunity to conduct team-based interdisciplinary research. During the course of this eight-week summer program,* participants will conduct research with a team of undergraduate and graduate students, and educators and industry professionals, while exploring the business-related aspects of technology.

Nanotechnology / Interdisciplinary •

Use of state-of-the-art research facilities at Yale/SCSU (NSF funded CRISP MRSEC). Research teams will work collaboratively with industry professionals on projects involving nano-medicine and nano-environmental studies. We will also explore the business aspects of technology.

Eligibility • This program is open to highly motivated undergraduate science students in all disciplines who have completed their sophomore year. Minorities, women and persons with disabilities are strongly encouraged to apply.

Application Process • The selection of IAF candidates is based on a personal statement, resume, academic transcript, and one letter of recommendation. The application will be available starting November 1, 2015 at: <http://southernct.edu/nanotechnology>

***Stipend •** Each participant will receive a stipend of up to \$5,000; \$3,000 during the eight weeks in the summer, and \$2,000 during the preceding spring and following fall semesters.
